

TOWNSITE OF REDWOOD MEADOWS ADMINISTRATION SOCIETY
BYLAW NO. 2018-001

A BYLAW OF THE TOWNSITE REDWOOD MEADOWS ADMINISTRATION SOCIETY WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWNSITE OF REDWOOD MEADOWS THAT IS LOCATED ON THE TSUUT'INA INDIAN RESERVE, #145, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO PROVIDE FOR THE RULES OF A WILDLIFE SMART COMMUNITY.

The Council of the Townsite of Redwood Meadows Administration Society has duly convened to enact the following:

1. TITLE

- (a) This bylaw shall be known as the "Wildlife Smart Community Bylaw."

2. INTERPRETATION

- (a) For the purpose of this bylaw, a substance is considered something that may attract Dangerous Wildlife if it is a food substance or other edible substance accessible to wildlife.
- (b) In this bylaw:
1. "Wildlife Attractant" means any substance that could be reasonably expected to attract Dangerous Wildlife.
 2. "Dangerous Wildlife" means bear, cougar, coyote or wolf; or a wildlife species deemed dangerous by a Bylaw Officer, Peace Officer, RCMP, Tsuut'ina Police, Police Officer within the province of Alberta, Fish and Wildlife or Conservation Officer.

3. PROVISIONS

- (a) No Sub lessee or resident other than a Bylaw Officer, Peace Officer, RCMP, Tsuut'ina Police or a Police Officer within the province of Alberta pursuant to the Bylaw Enforcement Bylaw, 2018-004, or Fish and Wildlife or Conservation Officer who is acting in the course of their duties shall store, collect, handle or dispose of Wildlife Attractants in such a way that the Wildlife Attractants are accessible to or may attract Dangerous Wildlife.
- (b) All Sub lessees or residents on a parcel of land within the Townsite shall not permit fruit from a tree, shrub or bush, or otherwise located on a parcel of land within the Townsite, to accumulate on the ground such that it attracts Wildlife.
- (c) All Sub lessees or residents shall not feed, attempt to feed or permit the feeding of Dangerous Wildlife and must not feed other animals or wildlife in a manner that is likely to attract Dangerous Wildlife.
- (d) All Sub Lessees or residents shall not place or permit the placement of feed

outdoors, including bird feed, seeds, suet, nuts, saltlicks or any other attractant between April 1st and November 30th of each year.

- (e) All Sub lessees or residents shall ensure all garbage, recycling and/ or compost containers are stored in a secure enclosure until the morning of collection.
- (f) All Sub lessees or residents shall ensure all garbage, recycling and/or compost is placed in a properly sealed container on the morning of collection day.
- (g) All Sub lessees or residents shall ensure all lids for composters are secured properly to ensure the odor is not an attractant.
- (h) All Sub lessees or residents shall ensure all barbeques, grills and smokers are reasonably clean and free of food when not in use, and grease cans are reasonably clean when not in use to safeguard against them being an attractant.
- (i) All Sub lessees or residents shall ensure all pet food and dishes are stored inside to ensure they are not an attractant.
- (j) All Sub lessees or residents shall ensure all yards are maintained and tidy to ensure they are not an attractant.
- (k) All Sub Lessees or residents are prohibited from allowing their domestic animals to roam freely or to chase any wildlife to ensure they are not an attractant.

4. ENFORCEMENT & PENALTIES

- (a) Any Sub lessee or resident who contravenes any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable for a minimum penalty in accordance with Schedule A of this bylaw.
- (b) Any Sub lessee or resident who contravenes any provision of this bylaw for which a penalty is not set out in Schedule A of this bylaw is liable for a minimum penalty of \$100 to a maximum of \$750.
- (c) For the purposes of this bylaw, an act or omission by a guest, an employee or agent of a Sub lessee or resident is deemed also to be an act or omission of the Sub lessee or resident if the act or omission occurred in the course of the guest's stay or employee's employment with the Sub lessee or resident, or in the course of the agent exercising the powers of performing the duties on behalf of the Sub lessee or resident under their agency's relationship.
- (d) If a partner of a partnership business is guilty of an offence under this bylaw, each partner of that business is deemed to have authorized the act or omission that constitutes the offence is guilty of the offence.
- (e) A Bylaw Officer, Peace Officer, RCMP, Tsuut'ina Police or a Police Officer within the province of Alberta pursuant to the Bylaw Enforcement Bylaw, 2018-004, is hereby authorized and

empowered to issue a Violation Tag or Ticket to any person, who a Bylaw Officer, Peace Officer, RCMP, Tsuut'ina Police or a Police Officer within the province of Alberta has reasonable or probable grounds to believe has contravened any provision of this bylaw.

5. ENCTMENT/ TRANSITION

- (a) If any clause in this bylaw is found to be invalid, it shall be severed from the remainder of the bylaw and shall not invalidate the whole bylaw.
- (b) Schedule A forms part of this bylaw.
- (c) This bylaw comes into force on the date it is passed.

6. CONFLICT WITH THE SOCIETIES ACT or ADMINISTRATION AGREEMENT

In the event of any inconsistency between this bylaw and the *Societies Act* or Administration Agreement the provisions of the *Societies Act* or Administration Agreement shall prevail.






